It is agreat pleasure to present the 52<sup>nd</sup>Annual Report of Balavidyalaya, the School for young deaf children.

#### Annual Day Celebration

Balavidyalaya celebrated the 52ndAnnual Day on 5<sup>th</sup>March 2022. This edition was held virtually as there was a lot of uncertainty across the country, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The programme began with a prayer by the staff and welcome address by Dr.ValliAnnamalai, Honorary Principal. We were fortunate to have Mr. YD Srinath, District Differently Abled Welfare Officer (DDAWO), State Government of Tamil Nadu, as the Chief Guest. The programme consisted of recordings of rhymes recited by three students who had completed the early intervention programme and were ready to join the mainstream. These recordings were screened, and the excitement of the children seeing themselves on the screen was infectious. Mrs. Pavithra Gurumurthy, Manasvini's mother, shared her experiences of bringing up Manasvini in the lockdown. Manasvini had joined us as a tiny tot of 1 year and 2 months and was ready to join the mainstream after having completed the programme in April 2022.

Dr. Meera Suresh, Honorary Vice-Principal, presented the Annual Report of the School. On this special day, we also had the opportunity to congratulate our colleagues, Dr. S. Subbulakshmi, Course Coordinator, Mrs. Hemalatha R, Assistant Headmistress and Mrs.Usha V, Teaching Staffer for having completed 30 phenomenal years of service. We also felicitated Mrs. Varalakshmi D, Ayah, Mr. S. Damodharan, Peon, for completing 20 glorious years of service, and Mrs. Tamizhselvi, Teacher Assistant, for completing 10 years in our organisation. Mr. Damodharan completed his service in our organisation and has since retired. The services of these staff were acknowledged and thanked in an earlier, online programme.



The events concluded with the vote of thanks delivered by Mrs.Meena Munusamy, Head Mistress.

Although the event was a virtual celebration with about 100 participants, we thank everyone for participating with wholehearted enthusiasm.

#### The School

Balavidyalaya, the School for young deaf children, admits only deaf children up to the age of three. There is no lower age limit. The youngest admitted so far was 52 days old. Admission is open throughout the year. All services in the School are offered free of charge. The School has two mediums of instruction – English and Tamil. After having dropped Tamil as a medium of instruction for a few years, it was resumed this year as the School found a substantial number of parents/caregivers struggling with English as the medium of instruction.

We wrapped up the last term of the academic year 2021-22 on April 29<sup>th</sup>2022. Our School reopened on June 6<sup>th</sup>2022 for the new academic year 2022-23.

Admissions are open throughout the year, as we believe that not a single day in a child's life should be wasted.

Post COVID-19, our School is slowly returning to the pre COVID-19 stage, both in the number of admissions as well as the progress of the students.

In the month of March 2022, we conducted a guidance programme for parents on how to provide language to the children. Dr. Subbulakshmi, Head Mistress and Mrs. Hemalatha, Assistant Headmistress observed the parent-child interaction and guided the parents on language input.

#### Let's Join Hands

In June 2022, we held a meeting with all the parents to get their opinions on different ways of helping them. The outcome was another meeting in August 22 where we conducted an empowerment programme, 'Let's join hands'. For this meeting, we invited some of the parents of some alumni. The current parents and parents of alumni had a healthy interaction without the staff around. We felt this would give them an opportunity to open up, get all their queries and doubts cleared, and motivate them to work with their children with more confidence. We take this opportunity to thank the alumni parents who pitched in enthusiastically.

This programme was attended by all the parents of the early intervention programme as well as the pre-school programme. We feel this is an effective empowerment programme and would like to conduct it every year. We invite volunteers of alumni parents to join us in this venture.



After this meeting, we approached the alumni parents and asked them for articles about their journey and shared them in social media to create awareness and motivate our current parents.

In the month of July 2022, we also had a parents meeting with our audiologist and supervisory staff. The parents were given further inputs on ear care and care and maintenance of hearing aids and implants.

#### Parent Workshop

In the month of November 22, we conducted a workshop on 'How festivals can be a language-rich environment', for current parents. We have made and printed new 'Let's talk about festivals' books on various religious, regional and national festivals. Parents read the books and participated in discussions on providing language to their children



using role play. In this process, one parent pretended to be a child, while another parent described each festival.

#### Spoken English Fluency Programme

During the month of March 2022, with the help of Mrs. Sanghamithra, a parent of one of our alumni, resumed spoken English fluency classes twice a week. She has been volunteering her time since 2019.

Since the month of December 2022, Dr Meera Suresh, Honorary Vice Principal, has also pitched in by taking spoken English fluency classes daily. These sessions are recorded and shared with the parents of the early intervention programme, who are





unable to leave their children at home and attend the programme.

#### Motivational Workshop for Staff

In February 2023 Dr Meera Suresh presented a motivational work shop for the staff. There was a healthy interaction amongst the staff during the workshop.



#### Visits by Alumni

We have more than 1400 children who have completed our programme and joined the mainstream. We derive immense pleasure when they visit us, and we are able to see them bloom into remarkable adults.

#### AWARENESS PROGRAMMES

#### World Hearing Day 2022

As part of an awareness programme during World Hearing Day, Dr Meera Suresh spoke to audiologists, speech therapists, ENTs and paediatricians across a few states to build awareness on the importance of early identification and early intervention. Dr ValliAnnamalai and Dr Meera Suresh visited Dr Subramaniam, a paediatrician, as part of the awareness programme. We appointed AdFactors, an advertising agency, to specifically advertise our School and its programmes, to build awareness in North India. Many regional publications of Tamil Nadu, Chennai, Ahmedabad, Delhi, Rajasthan, Gujarat and Odisha, published articles about Balavidyalaya.

Dr. Meera Suresh, was interviewed by AIR Rainbow – Hyderabad for a live show. She spoke about hearing loss and early intervention.

Institute of Speech and Hearing Disabilities (D) Regional Center, Odisha, Helen Keller Institute of Research & Rehabilitation for Disabled Children – Secundera bad, and Post Graduates of the Madras School of Social Work.

Speech and Hearing interns from AaruPadai Veedu College and Shri Ramachandra Institute of Higher Education and Research come in batches to spend time in the classrooms and the diagnostic centre.

Some interns from Shri Ramachandra Institute of Higher Education and Research did a study using a screening tool to diagnose hearing loss in the children, as part of their research project. Anganwadi workers measured the height and weight of all our children as part of their 'Healthy Child Campaign'. They offered our parents healthy porridge, in a powdered form.

A team from the Rangammal Memorial Trust, Thiruvannamalai, visited our sound-treated



classrooms and watched the school at work.

#### **Excursions & Celebrations**

The staff, parents and children from the early intervention programme went for an excursion to Children's Park in Guindy. The children enjoyed seeing the various birds and a few of the animals in the park.



Parents accompany pre-school children for their excursion every three years. This ensures that the parent gets a turn at least once,

#### Speech by Ms. Jayanthi - Pugazhendhis Aunt

A warm welcome to everyone present here. First I would like to say few words about myself. I am Miss. Jayanthi Pugazhendhi's aunt / caregiver. I was a very quiet and timid person. Pugazhendhi is my sister's son. My sister passed away when Pugazhendhi was 5 months old due to an accident.Pugazh does not know this. He thinks I am his mother and refers to me as Amma.

My parents are illiterate and I was given the responsibility of taking care of Pugazhendhi. At that time I was studying in my 2<sup>nd</sup> year in evening college. When I went to college my parents took care of him. The rest of the time he was my responsibility. When he was 9 months old we had a doubt if he could hear all the sounds. We felt as we were talking to him he was not responding to anything at all. We decided to go to a Doctor.

We went to many Doctors in various hospitals. They all diagnosed that he was hearing impaired. Everyone suggested I ensure Pugazh undergoes a cochlear implant surgery followed by rehabilitation. All our relatives talked ill about Pugazh's disability. I took it up as a challenge to prove to my relations that Pugazh will develop well inspite of his disability.

When Pugazhendhi was 2 years and 5 months he underwent the cochlear implant surgery. I took him for all the rehabilitation sessions. Due to the pandemic the rehabilitation sessions became online session. I attended them with Pugazh.

One day while browsing the net I saw the website of Balavidyalaya. I telephoned to the authorities. They took our details over the telephone and admitted Pugazh. By then he was 2 years and 8 months old. Pugazh and I attended the online classes. Finally after the pandemic eased and Balavidyalaya resumed off line classes I brought Pugazh to Balavidyalaya.

I had enrolled Pughzhin the English medium. My parents spoke very little English, my fluency was also not too good. When my parents talked to Pugazh they mixed English and Tamil. I tried to speak English as much as possible. Pugazh progressed and started understanding what we were saying. Gradually he started saying a few words. In March 2022 Balavidyalaya resumed spoken English Classes with a volunteer Mrs. Sanghamitra a parent of an alumni during the last hour of the day, twice a week. I attended the classes.

Then in December 2022 Dr. Meera Suresh the Honorary Vice Principal also started taking spoken English fluency classes every mornings. I attended these classes too. I found with the help of these classes my fluency was improving. I found Pugazh also improving.

Now Pugazhis able to talk to everyone, his reading and writing levels are above his age. He is ready to join a mainstream school.I am very happy that I have been able to help Pugazh develop like a normal child in spite of the various hurdles my family and I have faced. When my relatives visit us they are surprised to see Pugazhendhi's comfortably chatting away.

In the process of helping Pugazh my self-esteem and confidence has improved. Indirectly Pugazh has helped me to grow.

### Speech by Prithvi Sekhar – An alumni

I am Prithvi Sekhar, born with a hearing disability, I would like share my experiences as a differently abled person, challenges faced, and how they were overcome. I will share my thoughts on how success comes when you focus on what you have and never think about what you don't have. Chase your passion was my mantra.

I will also say something on the Decision-making Challenges I faced at each stage of my Life. I am using my life story just to highlight the path that is open to all of us, not to highlight my achievements.

If I can do it, anybody can.

I will start from the very beginning, my life changing moment – I entered Balavidyalaya as a 20 months old child. It was Balavidyalaya that shaped me into what I am today. Every bit of my success today has its roots in Balavidyalaya. It was Balavidyalaya which gave me the education, verbal communicationand hope for the future. My salutes to the School and all my teachers who shaped me, without them I will not be standing here today. It has helped thousands of needy children.

The School gave my parents the hope and teaching methods to truly believe that their child would be able to speak and communicate without using sign language. This trust and hope along with great support from the school shaped my initial life. At the end of 4 years stay in the school I was able to get into themain stream Bala Vidya Mandir as recommended by Balavidyalaya.

My first challenge in Bala Vidya Mandir was on how to get along with other friends as none of them were wearing any sort of hearing aids. With my friends and teachers support, I got along well and no one treated me differently or as a special child. I started believing that nothing is wrong with me and I am like others.

At this stage my parents noticed my natural sporting abilities and wanted to find if I have a passion for sports. I must have shown enough evidence so my parents chose to put me into individual sports like TENNIS at the age of 9.

I had big challenges as I had to play with the hearing aids on and at times missed the trainer's commands in the court. It was sweaty and irritating to play with the aids and the sounds of the ball hitting the floor was not fully audible. I had to put in extra efforts to overcome these difficulties.

Initially, it was difficult. In due course of time, I learned to deal with it. My family's support in all these years was exceptional. My mother used to accompany me to every tournament in the early days. My parents gave me a free hand to choose a path that I believed was right for me.

My sporting talents dramatically changed my status. I was a known, popular person and made lot of friends. It was hard to decide the future course once I passed out of my 10+2 from Kumarani Meena Muthiah Matriculation School.

I have had 3 major decision-making challenges so far and hopefully I have solved them.

#### Challenge 1- What to do after 10+2

With 82% score I was eligible to choose an Engineering course in Anna University. But my Tennis passion had grown strong and I wanted a college that will encourage my Tennis and allow me to study. By that time I was already an established Tennis player in the regular steam in Under 18 category in India. SRM University was the first to offer me Engineering seat with full scholarship.

I joined B.Tech (IT) course in SRM University under normal category sports quota. I played a lot of tennis there and was the captain of the University team for more than 2 years. I was winning GOLD medals in All India Tennis tournaments besides University tournaments.

#### Challenge 2- What to do after BTech

After completing B.Tech with Distinction, my mind was still on Tennis. I was again offered an MBA seat in SRM University with full scholarship and continued to represent the University. I actively played All India Inter University and All India Tennis Association (AITA) Tournaments. I completed my MBA with good grades.

#### Challenge 3- Job or Tennis

After MBA, I still wanted to keep playing tennis but definitely needed a job. I was picked up by Integral Coach Factory (Railways)in 2017based on my University level and All India level achievements in Tennis. I have been representing Railways winning many medals for Railways including GOLD medal in International Railway tournaments.

Some of my best moments in Life.....

I started representing INDIA on Deaflympics in 2013, and won my first Deaflympics medal in 2017 in Turkey. This is also the First ever Medal India achieved in Tennis. I made India proud by becoming the World **Champion** in 2019 and being nominated as the **Sports Person of the year 2019**.

My best year was in 2022 when I won 3 medals across all categories in the 2022 Deaflympics in Brazil. I was honoured by the Honourable Prime Ministerof India and the Honourable Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu. It is a great personal achievement for me.

My concluding words will be

Never stop trying. You only start failing when you stop trying. Because one day, you will achieve it. You must not lose hope but keep faith in yourself.
